The URC

Like all denominations food is important in our churches. URCs and other denominations regularly celebrate the meal we call communion. Bread and wine will be placed on a table and shared with each other as we remember Jesus dying for us and celebrate his being with us today.

Some churches use one common cup that is passed to all those taking part. In others, elders serve the congregation by handing out bread and individual cups to people where they sit. (Now used widely due to Covid)

In the URC, only Ministers of the Word and Sacraments and others specially authorised to do so can offer communion. We take communion as part of the universal church, and welcome all who wish to share in the meal.

Some services, like Messy Church, include food as well as events, picnics, BBQs and harvest suppers, bring and share lunches.

Food is also a large part of the URCs mission and outreach. Many of our churches have cafes that serve their communities, or offer meals for seniors, the homeless or dementia groups. Others are involved in food banks and free meals for school age children.

Trip to the Passion Play in Oberammergau and the Holy Land

Revd Paul Snell (County Ecumenical Officer for Churches Together in Devon) is leading a 10 day pilgrimage to visit the Passion Play in Oberammergau followed by the Holy Land, from 7th - 16th September this year. This is a unique opportunity to cover two sought after visits in one journey.

We fly to Munich, travelling on to Oberammergau, stay over for two nights to see the play (full board on this section of the trip) and then fly on to the Holy Land for a 7 day tour with 3 days in Jerusalem (including Bethlehem), a day visiting the Dead Sea and Masada, and 2 days in Galilee followed by a final day travelling via the Mediterranean coast and Caesarea.

This part of the trip is Half Board. We stay in good quality hotels, travel by private coach, have our own local guide and the trip includes full entrance fees to all sites.

There is an option of staying on for a further 3 days in Jerusalem.

Full details can be found via these links for the brochure and online booking form. No deposits are required at this stage because of the current ongoing pandemic but will be requested sometime in May.
